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WELFARE RIGHTS

Providing you & your family confidential advice around Benefits, Money, Advocacy, Support and more.

Following consultation with the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP), your Welfare Benefits Team are now in receipt of a letter directly relating to those who receive means tested benefits. This includes those individuals receiving Universal Credit, Pension Credit, ESA (Income based), JSA (Income Based), Housing Benefit, Council Tax Reduction, Working and Child Tax Credits.

Please find a copy enclosed for your records. The DWP have requested that you keep this letter in a safe place in case you need to make a claim for benefit in the future, or if you receive any queries about payments you receive.

Although the DWP need to know about WIBSS payments, they will not include them as income or capital when they calculate your benefit. You do **<u>not</u>** need to tell them about any payments from the former infected blood support schemes.

How do I notify the DWP?

You will only need to take action if you currently receive a means tested benefit <u>and</u> the DWP are <u>not</u> already aware of your WIBSS payments. **If you do <u>not</u> receive** Universal Credit, Pension Credit, ESA (Income based), JSA (Income Based), Housing Benefit, Council Tax Reduction, Working and Child Tax Credits, **you do <u>not</u> need to notify anyone.**

WIBSS wish to make the notification process as stress free as possible for you. Therefore, we have enclosed a template letter, for you to complete with your own personal circumstances and WIBSS payment amounts, which you can then post directly to the DWP. Please fill in all sections of the table, sign, print your name and date, then post to your relevant DWP department. The contact address to use varies from person to person, however the address will be on any of the letters you have received about your benefits or on www.gov.uk.

Lastly, we wish to reassure you that declaring your WIBSS payments will NOT change your benefit entitlements. All information provided to the DWP will be kept secure and confidential.

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PSYCHOLOGY & WELLBEING TEAM

The recent WIBSS Wellbeing Focus Group (held via Zoom due to Covid restrictions) was hosted by Caroline Coffey and Julie Armytage of the WIBSS Psychology and Wellbeing Service. All WIBSS members were invited and a small but lively group attended on the evening. Members were asked for their ideas to develop the Psychology and Wellbeing Service. There was agreement around creation of peer support opportunities and bringing people together as a community, through shared experience. As a result, the following ideas were agreed, to be presented to the wider WIBSS community for their input and opinion:

- 1) Regular Zoom and/or face to face regional meetings, to allow people to come together and discuss common themes and topics around wellbeing and share individual experiences.
- 2) A group regional social event, to bring together all those infected and affected, with the aim of creating a common community. The event could potentially encompass workshops with psychoeducational opportunities, links to promote peer support and guest speakers.
- **3)** The creation of a 'buddy' system, where people can register their interest in being paired with others within their community (small groups or one-to-one), to reduce isolation and create links with others through shared experience and peer support.
