The Infected Blood Compensation Authority

We are working with the Infected Blood Compensation Authority (IBCA), UK Government and Devolved Administrations around transferring responsibility for making regular support payments from the Infected Blood Support Schemes to IBCA.

To prepare for this transition, support schemes will only accept new applications which have been received by 31 March 2025.

All support schemes will remain open after 31 March 2025, and your existing support payments and annual winter fuel payment will continue to be paid.

If an existing scheme member dies between 1 January and 31 March 2025, their estate will have three months from date of death to apply for a bereavement lump sum payment.

Newly-bereaved partners of existing scheme members who die between 1 January and 31 March 2025 will also have three months from date of death to apply.

You can still apply for discretionary payments and grants after 31 March 2025, until you receive your offer of compensation from IBCA.

Only support payments and discretionary payments received after 31 March 2025 will be taken into account when IBCA calculates your compensation.



Pension Credit

With the current changes to the government winter fuel payment 2024 affecting pensioners, we want to remind you about pension credit. You need to apply to Pension Credit by December 21st to be entitled to the 2024 winter fuel payment. You must be state pension age to claim. WIBSS money is to be disregarded when calculating any means tested benefit, which includes Pension Credit.

When you apply for Pension Credit your income is calculated. If you have a partner, your income is calculated together.

Pension Credit tops up:

- your weekly income to £218.15 if you're single
- your joint weekly income to £332.95 if you have a partner

If your income is higher, you might still be eligible for Pension Credit if you have a disability, you care for someone, you have savings or you have housing cost.

Your income includes:

- State Pension
- other pensions
- earnings from employment and self-employment
- most social security benefits, for example Carer's Allowance

Any disability benefit, such as Personal Independence Payment, are disregarded when calculating your income for pension credit.

Take Five is a national campaign that offers straightforward and impartial advice to help everyone protect themselves from financial fraud. They urge you to stop and consider whether the situation is genuine – to stop and think if what you're being told really makes sense. Money Helper is a useful government backed website. It provides advice and support on a wide variety of money matters. It provides advice that if you do lend money to anybody, such as a family member, you should put this agreement in writing and come up with a payment plan of how this money is going to be paid back to you.

Money Helper brings together three government backed financial guidance providers: The Money Advice Service, the Pensions Advisory Service and Pension Wise. Money Helper can provide advice on money and pensions and provides handy calculators for example, benefit calculators and mortgage calculators.
